# View from the Pew!




The Parish Council heard further representation about speeding along Buckden Road. Unfortunately for the residents concerned, their properties fall outside the 400m approaches to the village and therefore the Parish Council cannot exercise any rights under the

Localism Act. However, Peter Downes came along to the meeting with the speed gun mentioned at an earlier meeting. The gun is now on loan to the PC for the purposes of gathering traffic data which may support a call for safety measures, including a change in the speed limit. It must be stressed that vehicle speed is the only data collected. There is no report produced and no data on vehicles such as registration number, make or model is collected.

The Parish Council and James Snell will be arranging sessions for data collection.

We are sorry to learn that Peter Downes is no longer our District Councillor, although he remains our representative on the County Council. Mr John Morris attended the PC meeting with Mr Downes as the will be standing for the LibDems District Council seat.

The Community Shop committee have prepared the terms of a lease of land at the village hall car park for the siting of the temporary shop building. The lease be granted by the Village Hall Management Committee who will be asked to agree the terms.

## Grafham Oil Syndicate

Grafham Oil Syndicate is now 18 months old and around 350,000 litres and £200,000 later, we have managed to collectively keep about



£20,000 in our pockets thanks to bulk purchasing. Grafham has 250 households, the majority dependent on oil. We have 125 members which is fantastic and we hope that over time, we have helped reduce slightly the amount of oil tanker traffic into and out of the village. It's not too late to sign up so feel free to email relevant details to grafhamoil@gmail.com and you're in. Next delivery is planned for the first week of June. Simon

have asked the Parish Council to consider taking out a Public Works Loan for £10,000 to be made available to the shop. Given the high priority placed on the provision of community facilities (e.g. shop and pub) in the Parish Plan and the support shown by questionnaire replies, the Council agreed to approach the National Association of Local Council for advice and guidance on applying for such a loan. The estimated costs per month to each household in Grafham would be in the region of 70p.

Councillors reported that dog faeces are being deposited in the rubbish bin on the children's playground. Firstly, this is not an appropriate way to dispose of dog faeces. In the absence of



special bins, dog faeces should be taken home by the dog's owner and disposed of there. Secondly, dogs are not allowed in the playground because of the health issues posed by dog faeces. Please dispose of all your dog's waste in an appropriate and responsible manner.

The Parish Council will be offering a letter of support to the Parish Meeting at Diddington in their guest for safety measures at the entrance to their village from the A1, both north and southbound. There have been many accidents and a recent fatality involving the slip roads, but they have so far been unable to convince the County Council of the need for road improvements.

The date of the next Parish Council meeting is Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> May and this will be preceded at 7.30pm by the Annual Parish Meeting. This is your opportunity to hear reports from County, District and Parish Council about their activities in the past year and their plans for the future.

This made front page news in a local paper in 1953. Proposed Bypass Casualty Corner: Something must be done at Ellington; a spate of accidents alarms villagers. Yew Tree Farm Casualty Corner is what the people of Ellington call the dangerous bend at the eastern approach to their village. After years of problems, the bypass finally happened in 1958, as this map shows the council suggested road improvements. The only down side to this was the village shop and the Mermaid lost some of their Ellington passing trade. The committee of Jenny Barnes, Andy Kent, Andrew Duckworth, Karen Stewart, Chris Bulow and Margaret Life are now the Management Committee of the Society. We are keeping our website up to date with news as it happens and our business plan and Code of Conduct are now available to view. You can follow us on Twitter and you can join our Facebook group. Also on the website you will be able to register for our newsletters to be sent to you by email, find out all you need to know about becoming a volunteer and register your interest in becoming a member with all that would entail. We will also be inviting the residents of Ellington to volunteer or become members. We are very close to agreeing a lease with the Village Hall Management Committee, opening our bank account with the Co-op Bank plc and registering for VAT. From then on we will be applying for planning permission and grant funding and we will be asking for donations from organisations such as Anglian Water, Luminus Homes, Tesco and Sainsbury's. We will be exploring the opportunities to offer services such as parcel collection point, home delivery (if you really can't get out), a cup of coffee, a book exchange, selling event tickets and displaying notices. This is your community and your shop. We will endeavour to ensure that the shop is everything you need it to be. ## Speeding Traffic

Many of you will have read my first letter to the Grafham Gossip, about speeding in the village. This letter, which will be the last one, is written with sadness. Our neighbours Gary and Gemma

and their two children were walking their beloved and not very old German Shepherd Dog, Schumi, on Breach Rd when Schhumi was knocked down and killed by a speeding pick-up. The pick-up was white or light blue.

The most saddening part of this is that the speeder did not even have the balls to stop; the driver just sped off leaving Schumi at the side of the road. The situation was devastating and yes, I know this because my wife Sarah and I had the unfavourable task, after a phone call from Gemma, of getting round to the place where they stood and Schumi lay.

Gemma had to break the news to their youngest son Ethan and then I had to drive the family, with Schumi, to the vets.

I hope with all my heart that the driver of the pick-up gets no sleep and has suffered a vast amount of costly damage to his or her vehicle. This is not one of those 'turn the other cheek' situations, so, 'What is next and when will it be?' If they can kill a dog and drive off just think what they will do when it is one of your family - you know the ones - son, daughter, wife, mother, dad, father.



On the news this evening, 8th April 2013, many councils across the country are putting up new speed limit signs in their towns and as well as the new signs of 20 MPH they are adding the wording '20 is plenty'.

I hope that at some stage the driver of the pick-up and others who think it is fine to drive at whatever speed they see fit, get everything that's coming to them. I hope it is sooner rather than later.

## **NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH**

On Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> April residents were subjected to in excess of 100 motor bikes riding up and down Buckden Road, parking in the Grafham Water car park and then

performing stunts to each other including riding on one wheel. The police dealt with the matter.

No other reported incidents in the village.

The Chief Constable of Cambridgeshire in recognising the failure of the police to

work nationwide with Neighbourhood Watch, a strategic team led by Superintendent Mike Brown will prepare an action plan identified by the Cambridgeshire Neighbourhood Watch executive committee to which Grafham belongs. I will keep everyone posted on progress.

I have been asked to pass on the following information:

#### "I NEED MONEY FOR PETROL"

Scammers are working in the county, usually in supermarket car parks. If someone asks for your help and starts to give you a sad story why they cannot pay for petrol and asks for money, just say "No."

Do not accept jewellery or a watch as security – it will be worthless.

When safe to do so call the police – do not wait until you get home.

#### **CRIME PREVENTION – HEATING OIL THEFT**

With rising fuel prices there has been an increase in the theft of diesel oil from commercial vehicles and heating oil from storage tanks.

The following tips may help you to deter a theft:

- Plant shrubs to hide your tank from view.
- Oil level sensor alarms are available from £75.
- Consider CCTV if the tank is in a vulnerable or remote location. Deter thieves from entering your property by installing and using lockable gates. Maintain boundaries and perimeter fencing.
- If you have a plastic tank, consider erecting fencing around the tank with one end hinged and locked for

filling purposes. The fencing should be fixed to solid posts and should be set off the tank approximately 12 inches on all sides.

## New commander sets Huntingdonshire priorities

CRIME has continued to fall in Cambridgeshire with more than five thousand fewer victims compared to last year, annual figures have revealed. Statistics produced by the force for the year ending March 31, show there were 46,435 crimes in 2012/13, a 10.1 per cent drop

on the year before when there were 51,658. It **Cambridgeshire** Burglary fell by one per cent, or 28 offences, also represents a drop of more than 28 per cent in total crime in the past five years. In 2008/09, there were 64,663 offences.

In the past year, there have also been significant, double-digit percentage falls in crime categories including criminal damage and arson. Assistant Chief Constable Mark Hopkins said:

"The force has undergone significant changes in the past two years so I am very pleased that we have maintained our focus on tackling crime. It is particularly pleasing to see more than 5000 fewer victims of crime in the past year, and in offences such as robbery, assault and criminal damage, that can have such an impact on victims."


